Resuming Court Operations

Upon consideration of recent changes to public health guidance and conditions within Washington, D.C. and the National Capital Region, the court finds that the existing restrictions on court operations are no longer necessary.

IT IS ORDERED THAT:

- (1) Administrative Order No. 2021-10 (June 22, 2021) is rescinded, effective September 12, 2022, 12:01 a.m. (Eastern), at which point the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit shall resume normal operations.
- (2) The Clerk's Office remains authorized to issue any additional health and safety protocols procedures necessary to support in-person argument or to provide accessibility availability of the Clerk's Office to receive nonelectronic filings pursuant to Federal Rule of Appellate Procedure 26 and Federal Circuit Rule 26. The Clerk's Office shall provide public notice on the court's website of any such protocols or procedures.
- (3) The Clerk's Office is further directed to continue to provide online audio streaming of public court hearings.
