ORDER AND SUPPORTING MEMORANDUM

The complainant has filed judicial misconduct complaints concerning three judges of this court who served on a merits panel that decided two of his appeals.

The complainant alleges that the judges made improper substantive and procedural rulings, including “withholding [his] Rights Of Defense Of Evidence” and “causing irrefutable Harm to [him], his Case, and 18 other U.S. Civilians.” These claims relate directly to the merits of the judges’ rulings and must therefore be dismissed. *See* Rule 11(c)(1)(B) of the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings.

The complainant also contends that the judges were biased and discriminated against a “[f]ederally [p]rotective [c]lass.” However, adverse rulings are not proof of bias and discrimination. And these allegations lack sufficient evidence to raise an inference of any judicial misconduct here and must also be dismissed. *See* Rule 11(c)(1)(D).
