ORDER AND SUPPORTING MEMORANDUM

Before this court is a judicial misconduct complaint concerning a judge of the United States Court of Federal Claims.*

A complaint concerning a judge of the Court of Federal Claims must be filed with the clerk of that court. *See* Rule 7(a)(2) of the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings. Under these circumstances, dismissal of the complaint is appropriate. *See* Rule 11(c)(1)(F) (allowing the dismissal of complaints “filed in the wrong circuit under Rule 7”); Rule 3(e) (defining “circuit” to mean courts, like the Court of Federal Claims, that are “designated in 28 U.S.C. § 363”).

* To the extent complainant asserts wrongdoing by other individuals not covered by the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings, the court also does not accept any complaint against those individuals. *See* Rule 8(d).
