ORDER AND SUPPORTING MEMORANDUM

The complainant filed documents received December 19, 2022, and January 25, 2023, appearing to raise judicial misconduct complaints against a district court judge and a magistrate judge of the United States District Court for the Eastern District of New York, a district court judge of the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York, and two district court judges of the United States District Court for the Middle District of Florida.

Under Rule 11(c)(1)(F) of the Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings, complaints must be dismissed when filed in the wrong court. Ordinarily, a complaint against a judge "must be filed with the circuit clerk in the jurisdiction in which the subject judge holds office." Rule 7(a)(1).* Here, because the identified judges "hold[] office" in the jurisdiction of the Second Circuit (for the Eastern District of New York and South-

ern District of New York judges) and Eleventh Circuit (for the Middle District of Florida judges), the complaints were filed in the wrong court and hence must be dismissed.

Accordingly,

IT IS ORDERED THAT:

The complaints are dismissed.
